The courses equip members of the community and community workers with the skills and knowledge to give advice and guidance on education and training.

What Is Covered In The Course:

- Identifying and understanding barriers to learning.
- Basic Skills Awareness. Action planning.
- What is the role of a Community Learning Rep.
- What courses and types of learning are available.
- Progression routs in education.
- Listening, communication, interviewing skills
- Support systems for adult Learners.
- Understanding educational terms and qualifications.

The role of a Community Learning Rep is voluntary but there is a qualification in advice and guidance at the end of the course plus extra training and support if needed.
